

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Pregnancy Terminology

- Antepartum: The period of time before childbirth.

- Embryo: The developing baby in the womb during the first eight weeks of pregnancy.
- Placenta: The organ that connects the mother to the baby and provides nourishment and oxygen.
- Amniotic fluid: The fluid that surrounds the baby in the womb.
- Ultrasound: A medical test that uses sound waves to create images of the baby in the womb.
- Prenatal care: The medical care that a pregnant woman receives during pregnancy.
- Due date: The estimated date of delivery.
- Labor: The process of giving birth.

Childbirth Terminology


- Vaginal delivery: The process of giving birth through the vagina.
- **Cesarean section**: A surgical procedure in which the baby is delivered through an incision in the abdomen.
- **Episiotomy**: A surgical cut made in the perineum (the area between the vagina and the anus) to prevent tearing during childbirth.
- Forceps delivery: A delivery in which forceps (metal instruments) are used to help deliver the baby.
- Vacuum extraction: A delivery in which a vacuum extractor (a suction cup) is used to help deliver the baby.
- Postpartum: The period of time after childbirth.
- Breastfeeding: The process of feeding a baby with breast milk.

 Formula feeding: The process of feeding a baby with formula (artificial milk).

Other Important Terminology

- OBGYN: A doctor who specializes in obstetrics and gynecology (pregnancy and childbirth).
- Midwife: A healthcare professional who assists women with pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum care.
- Doula: A non-medical professional who provides emotional and physical support to women during pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum.
- Hospital: A medical facility where women can give birth.
- Birth center: A facility that provides a home-like environment for women to give birth.

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
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
