



Rockefeller married Laura Celestia Spelman in 1864. They had five children: Elizabeth, John, Alta, Edith, and Bessie.

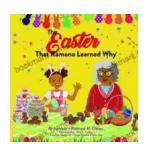
