




Kincaid was born in St. John's, Antigua, in 1949. She moved to the United States in 1966 to attend high school. She later studied at Franconia College in New Hampshire and Columbia University in New York City. Kincaid's work has been praised for its lyrical prose and its unflinching exploration of themes such as race, gender, and colonialism. She has been awarded numerous prizes for her writing, including the Anisfield-Wolf Book Award and the National Book Critics Circle Award.
